A YEAR OF CELEBRATION!

Now that we're in the thick of the new year, I'd like to suggest a goal for our St. John's family:

Celebrate all ministries and accomplishments when we impact our neighbors' lives!

One of the new practices that I reflected on from my **Leading Well** retreat centered on making sure that we take time to look at what we're accomplishing and lifting that up to our church family. That means that we need to not only do what we do, but then to share it so that our work can become contagious to others who may be watching intently on the sidelines.

A book I've read recently is entitled, *Ask, Thank, Tell* by Charles Lane. In it Charles (Chick) reminds us to make sure that our story is being shared so that people know what we're up to. Yes, I realize that many of us work hard to stay humble (which is important!), but that should not prohibit us from sharing our collective story that shapes the life and ministry that we have here at St. John's.

One of the new habits that I'm working on this year reflects this notion. For years, I have tracked my hours to make sure I have some semblance of balance in my life. That, however, has brought me to an unhealthy habit — defining my effectiveness as measured by the number of hours that I have worked. There very well can be a correlation there, but not necessarily. In speaking with my cohort support group from **Leading Well**, a new habit has emerged. I will now measure my effectiveness by my accomplishments (tracking my visits, pastoral care appointments, time spent with colleagues, time spent with staff helping them to be effective leaders, etc.) That shapes my story as a pastor and some of those measurable achievements can be shared! Maggie Olson, a long-term member of St. John's and one full of wisdom, has suggested that we track the number of volunteer hours that our church provides for our community. I love this idea because it helps us measure our effectiveness. I also want to add to that idea to capture the stories of the lives we touch. My hope is that we can capture more pictures, more videos, more narratives from volunteers and recipients of our care to share and celebrate this year. We can illustrate these images in a variety of different ways, which will not only share our story with you all, but also inspire others to join our work.

If we don't take time to celebrate our ministry, we neglect part of our Christian heritage. If the gospel writers did not share the life of Christ, we'd never know about it. If artists neglected to portray the Biblical narrative, we'd have a hole in that history. So if we don't share and celebrate our story, the future generations will be far less aware of our impact and heritage.

Please help me make 2016 a year of celebration and be an active participant in our story!
