THE WHOLENESS WHEEL Social Health

This month, I'd like to lift up the importance of caring for our social health. This is a concern that has grown in my heart as your pastor ever since March, 2020. Yes, I'm sorry for bringing it upon yet another time: Covid-19.

One doesn't need to be a licensed anthropologist, therapist, or counselor to observe that Covid caused us to isolate ourselves (in the most literal sense of the word, mind you!) further and further. I recall trying to teach confirmation on zoom - ugh. I remember getting back to in person class too - better, but still ugh. It's almost like we forgot how to enjoy each other and the gift that comes with in person connection! And from my perspective, it's also what's playing a significant role in the decline of our social health. Not the ONLY factor, but a significant factor nonetheless!

A few years ago, at our first council retreat during my tenure, Pastor Erin Nelson led us in a conversation that led us to the conclusion that we needed to rebuild the relationships within our church family. Since then, I have seen our church council take that conclusion to heart and truly offer their time and energy in creating opportunities for us to gather in addition to worship. In fact, the fellowship committee was largely composed of church council members!

I hope you've had a chance to enjoy at least some of their work:

Each of these activities are aimed at creating community, something we all need, regardless of where we land on the introvert/extrovert scale.

This past weekend, our confirmation youth helped drive this point home. At our full night lock-in, 19 confirmation students were joined by five high school youth and a record 15 friends! I recall an early conversation with one of the friends who wasn't too pleased that we displaced her phone for the night. I was proud to see one of our youth inform her friend that you will be way too busy having fun to even notice the absence of her phone! Turns out, she was right. Instead of spending the night at home with their phones, our youth came together and had so much fun just being kids, including a very meaningful worship at the lock-in. Why? Relationships matter.

When God created the world, God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." (Genesis 2:18). What does that tell you about God? Relationships are a gift from God to be tended to, nurtured, and sustained. We were created as built in helpers to each other.

Who is in your inner circle? Who knows your faults and commits to you anyway? Whom have you welcomed into your life? Make the effort to come together. You never know what new friend is out there!
