## **SUMMER SABBATH**

Ever since I started my pastoral ministry in 1999, I have found myself preaching time and time again to families the importance of sabbath. I frequently use a biblical lesson from Exodus 20 to prove my point:

Exodus 20:8-11 Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work -- you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it. This passage is taken directly from the 10 Commandments. Most other commandments are a single sentence with no explanation. For some reason, we have the above passage added to the third commandment to help us understand how important sabbath is.

Whenever I teach the 10 Commandments in confirmation, I love teaching about this one because students are stunned that you can follow this commandment by taking a nap, going on a vacation, doing whatever it is that restores your soul. The other part of sabbath is to ground yourself with God, which is where worship plays a prominent role.

This year, we had to make a difficult decision to postpone our Wednesday worship services until the fall. So that puts a bit more emphasis on our Sunday worship, which I hope continues to restore your soul. Listening to the Word of God, praying, singing, these are all ways that we can restore our souls.

And now for a turn you might not expect! Church is not the only place of restoration. In fact, now that we are recording our worship services so that you can worship on your own time, I'd argue that you should be even more free to restore, perhaps heal if needed! I hope that your summer is a time when you can find that connection with God in the things that help you rest. Yes, summers can be crazy too, but don't forget to schedule in a well-timed vacation. View a sunset over the lake. Listen to the roar of the waves or the songs of the birds. Watch a child at play giggling with everything they have.

If you find yourself away on a Sunday morning healing and restoring, enjoy our online worship. Consider making a repeating contribution using our online giving methods found on the front page of our website to show your consistent gratitude toward God for all of your blessings. Then enjoy the abundant life that God deeply desires for you! Christ's love"!


