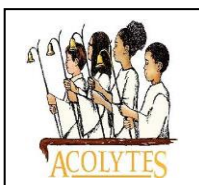
In order to make this blitz a success, we need your help! We will need people to help provide snacks and lunch to provide that extra boost that the workers need.

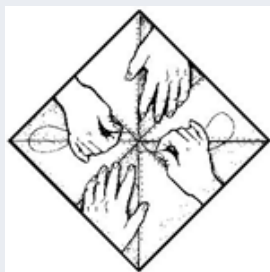

# Pastor News

## THE HIGH PRIESTLY PRAYER

Later this month, you will hear the passion narrative according to Luke. On Passion/Palm Sunday (March 24), the gospel will be the primary substance of the worship as we participate together in reading Luke's version of Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday and ending on the cross. This is one of my favorite parts about Holy Week as it truly puts the story in perspective when we read it as a whole and not in parts. Next year we will do the same on Passion/Palm Sunday, only from Matthew's perspective. In 2015, we will take Mark's account as the source.

Matthew, Mark, and Luke are considered *Synoptic* Gospels because the authors utilized similar sources when writing them and thus they are organized in a similar fashion. The gospel of John, however, was written and organized in a very unique manner.

One of the unique stories in John is the 17<sup>th</sup> chapter. As part of the Last Supper narrative, John includes what we call *The High Priestly Prayer*. Jesus prays for his disciples because he knows the future that they face – a future of persecution and trial. Jesus prays for them because he loves them dearly and wants them to succeed as they form the Christian church following his Ascension. Jesus prays for them because they are the family of God.

I have been waiting to share the following insight with you for quite some time now. I feel that one of my sacred privileges as your pastor is to pray for you and with you. I am thankful that the office of Pastor grants me an automatic trust from many of you, a trust that I want to maintain. That trust invites opportunities to enter your lives as a spiritual leader. These entrances include sharing your joys along with your sorrows and anything in between. That is why I am writing this article in this manner. I need your help to find those entrances.

When it comes to your physical, emotional, and spiritual welfare, I want to be a know-it-all! If you are hospitalized, no matter what the reason, I want to know (preferably in advance and not in hindsight!) If your marriage is bumpy, I want to know. If your family life is struggling, I want to know. If you are angry with God, I want to know. Get the picture? By no means am I promising a "fix" to your struggles, but I can promise you companionship along the way. I can promise you a listening ear. I can promise you my prayers.

I am not Christ, but I want to follow his lead. Jesus walked with and prayed for his disciples and I want to walk with and pray for you. In our lives it's easy to share our joys (I want to be there for those too!), but difficult to share our sorrows. You have called me to be your pastor, which means when I visit the sick and comfort the afflicted, I represent the community of St. John's. Contact me at any time. Let me repeat that – contact me at any time – and let me pray for and with you.
