Council Member for the Month of October Lydia Blaha

Compensation package for new Youth Director position was presented. A working copy of proposed job description will be sent out to Council members to review before next meeting.

Committees need to have budget numbers to Pastor/Victoria before next meeting.

Mission Fair will begin at 4:45 on Wednesday, September 11. Participants may return signed cards to fishbowl for drawing to be held on Rally Day. Prizes are St. John's t-shirt or hand painted African pins donated by Marla. There will be 10 winners. Tickets for quilt raffle will be sold for \$1 each or 6 for \$5. Winner will be drawn at Reformation meal. Proceeds to benefit Good Samaritan Fund.

August 5, 2019

Fundraiser Chair Folders: Assembled folders for the Mission Fair to distribute to potential fundraiser chairperson(s) for the following:

Additional Fundraising ideas are Cake Rolls (same company as Butter Braid, 50% profit) Suggestion to sell Cake Rolls for delivery before Easter. Kwik Trip gas cards that are purchased from Kwik Trip for a lower price and sold for profit. Discussed working at Concession stands, which is not ideal due to typically short notice.

Decision was made to keep all fundraising options open during orientations and Mission Fair and have fundraisers decided on by early October.

Will clarify that Marla is NOT the chairperson on fundraisers, and that events will not take place without chairperson(s).

Will emphasize that chairperson(s) are responsible to keeping track of volunteer names and hours to provide to youth director so credit is received for volunteering.

Mission Fair/Rally Day: Will present to Council the idea to switch dates for Rally Day and Mission Fair. Proposed dates are September 11th and 15th for Mission Fair and September 18th for Rally Day. This would give more time to recruit/finalize mentors/guides.

Marla has pins that can be used at Mission Fair for those that return full punch cards.

Marla has policy folder started and will pick up display board for Mission Fair.

Marla and Melissa will work together on display on August 13 at 3:30.

Marla will ask Victoria to remove dates from Consent/Liability form so they don't need updating.

Marla will send an email to parents encouraging them to fill out registration forms online.

Deadline to have forms in is September 30. Youth without returned forms cannot participate in Faith Formation/Confirmation until forms are completed and returned.

Discussed games for youth during Mission Fair. Marla will speak with Youth in Action about helping with games. Potentially, GAGA pit for older youth and Bounce House for younger children. Marla will get information on acquiring Bounce House.

Possible Rally Day games are GAGA pit; Chalk the Walk Contest with prizes; Scavenger Hunt; Basketball; Four Square.

Discipline/Building Policies: Marla shared information with Pastor about keeping policies positive. Pastor and Melissa will meet to discuss policy and have ready before orientations.

Looking for ideas for youth to burn off extra energy during 5-5:30 prior to Faith Formation. In the past, youth that came directly from school would have snack, share highs and lows, play basketball with Nicholas/watch a movie/help Marla set up spaces. Youth need TWO options for time between 5-5:30: sit and eat OR an organized activity. Need to brainstorm ideas: Work on craft? Yoga? Also need people to help facilitate these activities.

Faith Five Mentors:

Marla will distribute membership role to youth committee members to look over and suggest those suited to be a youth mentor/guide.

Pastor will also ask for volunteers in the bulletin, powerpoint, newsletter, announcements. There was a request for cubbies for preschool youth for jackets/projects. Marla will clean out KinderMusik cabinets for preschool to use.

There was a suggestion to offer Faith Formation on an additional evening. Lisa will write up questions and Melissa will create a Survey Monkey to send out to parents to see what kind of interest there would be in an additional evening for Faith Formation, as well as guides.

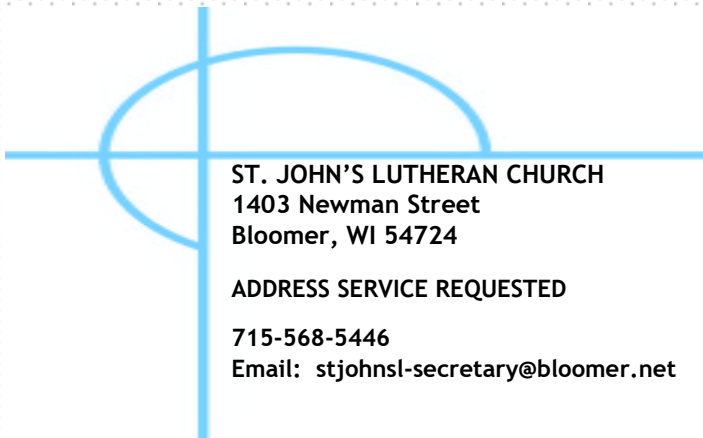
