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New Sunday morning fellowship hour set to start Sept. 15. I was recently at a conference that challenged us to initiate an experiment in our churches. Allow me to introduce mine.

Lutherans have the reputation for keeping our faith stories to ourselves. Some of us are too nervous. Some are afraid of offending. Some don't feel that they have a story. Whatever the reason, we are not known for sharing our faith stories. So I want to change that!

On Sunday mornings, I want to introduce a culture shift at St. John's. Many worshipers leave the sanctuary after the service. Others stay and catch up with friends in the narthex area with a cup of coffee. I'd like to invite Sunday worshipers to now come downstairs to the dining hall. You can still have your cup of coffee. You can still catch up with friends. But when I come downstairs after greeting everyone after church – get ready! I want to teach you the tools of sharing your faith story.

Each week I will introduce a theme, a question, or a discussion starter that will relate to everyone. As you are gathered around the table, you can then offer how it applies to your life. As an example, possible questions might read, "Why are you a Christian?" followed by "Why do you go to church?"

To help set the stage, I'd love for you to consider donating a treat every now and then. Nothing elaborate, just a coffee cake, assorted breads, donuts, or some fruit. St. John's will provide the coffee!

So come on downstairs and hear the stories that this church can provide. Bring a friend to this very informal gathering. While your children are away growing in their faith, stay and grow in your faith! Even if you don't have children staying for that time period, come anyway! I know that it will benefit you and therefore it will benefit the family at St. John's.

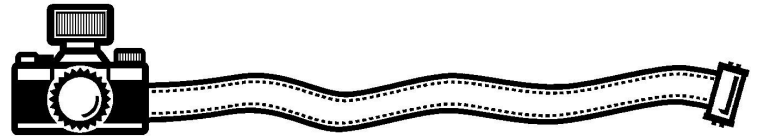

INTRODUCING KIDS' NITE OUT!

Childcare providers needed

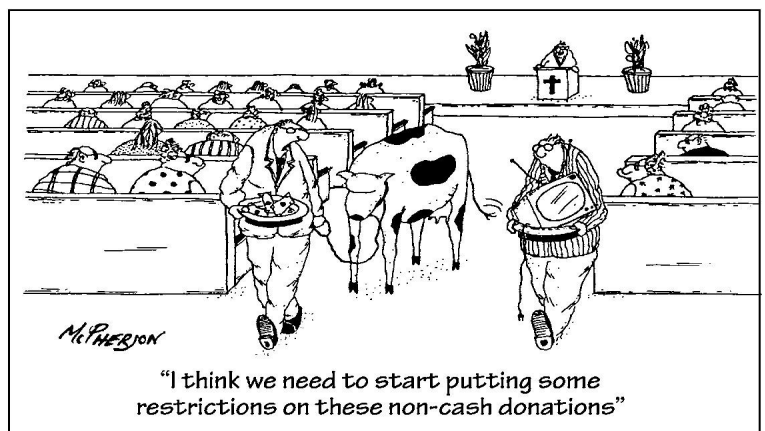

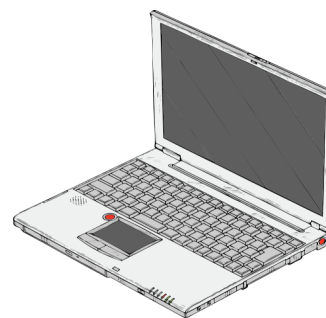
Thank you to all that have donated aluminum cans! We are no longer accepting donations at this time.

They won't have to clean up any messes but their own. They won't even have to prepare the meal or even clean up! (But they will have to pay the bill...)

There will be a sign up list the week prior to the event so that we know whom to expect and where to make reservations. 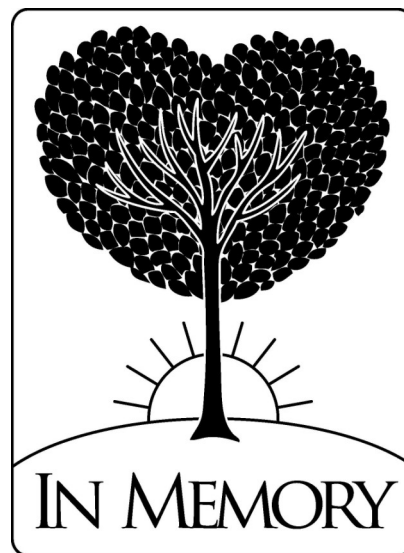

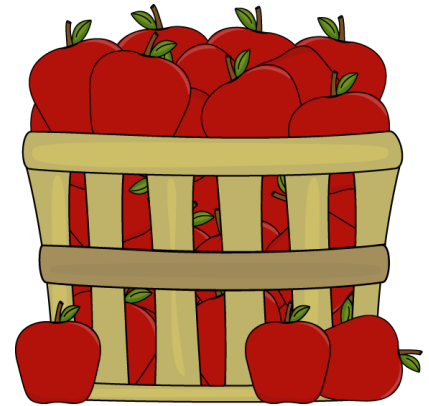
