## IT IS FINISHED!

They are three of the most powerful words in all of scripture from my perspective as they reveal the human side of the Son of God, one who must experience death, just like the rest of us. Of course we know that the story does not end there! On the third day, he overcomes the grave and saves us for all eternity - the greatest gift given to humankind!

In a much different context, these three words still pack a punch. In the context of the July church council meeting, where the church council unanimously approved a very important motion, we can now celebrate the elimination of our church debt! Because of many years of faithful givers, we have consistently pecked away at a building debt that once totaled \$264,900 back in 2009. More recently, the St. John's Foundation agreed to pay off the loan in Sept. of 2018 for \$61,637.67 and charge the church at a lower interest rate, a true gift from a fine group of dedicated members. And finally, due to the recent estate gifts from Darlene Hass and Mick Kelm, the church council decided to pay off the remaining \$38,732.72 to the foundation and so for the first time in well over a decade, St. John's is debt-free! IT IS FINISHED!

For those of you who have been faithful contributors by giving specifically to our building loan, we are truly grateful. For those of you who have been faithful contributors to St. John's, you helped us make our monthly payments to the foundation for which we are truly grateful. This is exciting news and we are now free to consider other opportunities with your generosity, opportunities to make real impacts on the people we serve!

Stay tuned for further information regarding a public celebration where we can come together and lift up our voices, praising God for giving us the ability to be mission minded with our financial resources. May this feat inspire us for continued generosity as we enter a new year of growing disciples following a summer never to be forgotten. Our facility has and will continue to be a tremendous resource and the debt will no longer hold us back. Thanks be to God!
